Parents can request a copy at any time from the school district."

Host: "Parents and Guardians should read the procedural safeguards carefully to fully understand their rights and the protections available to their child. Keeping a copy handy can help you reference these rights if any questions or concerns arise. The procedural safeguards document is lengthy and can have confusing legal language. So, it's also a good idea to discuss any unclear points with your child's special education team."
